II. FERAL HOG UPDATE

The Kyle Parks and Recreation Department is actively working to address the increased presence of feral hogs in certain areas within city-owned property, specifically within the Waterleaf Park area.

To better manage the issue, staff are currently working within the existing feral hog trapping contract. Trap installation at Waterleaf Park will begin Sunday, Dec. 22, 2024 and take place incrementally over the next week. Parks is working with the trapper to select an appropriate spot to best capture the complete sounder (a family group of feral pigs) and pre-baiting the areas to desensitize the pigs to the traps. Once the traps have been set up, they will be monitored regularly using game cameras and only set off when the entire sounder is inside. If the trap is set without the entire sounder captured, the pigs outside the trap will learn and are unlikely to ever be trapped. The trapper will then humanely transport the feral hogs to a USDA holding facility to be processed. Once the sounder at Waterleaf has been captured and removed, parks staff will evaluate whether other traps are needed at this time.

Feral hog populations are an ongoing issue. The population will rise and fall as we reduce the population, and it rebounds. There is currently no "silver bullet" solution for feral hogs, as this is an invasive, exotic species that is smart, highly durable, and reproduces rapidly. But by working with trappers to reduce and manage the population at an acceptable level, the city hopes to mitigate the impact of feral hogs on public land as well as our local ecosystems

In the meantime, residents are reminded to exercise caution when encountering feral hogs. Here are some important safety tips:

- 1. **Stay at a Safe Distance:** Feral hogs can be aggressive if they feel threatened or nursing mothers are protecting their young. Keep a safe distance and avoid approaching or feeding them.
- 2. **Avoid Confrontation:** If you encounter a feral hog, remain calm and back away slowly. Do not attempt to chase, corner, or provoke the animal.
- 3. **Secure Trash and Food Sources:** Feral hogs are attracted to food sources, so it's important to secure trash, pet food, and other potential attractants to discourage them from settling in residential areas.
- 4. **Report Sightings:** If you spot feral hogs within city limits, report the sighting to the Kyle Parks Department at conservation@cityofkyle.com.

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank & Pump Station:

- PEC placed permanent transformer pole and transferred power lines from temporary pole.

- Lime treatment of subgrade underway on Avenue A from Burnham to Everett Street.


Wastewater Treatment Plant Office Trailers:
