Kyle Parks and Recreation Open Space (PROS) Master Plan Public Outreach

The City of Kyle Parks and Recreation Open Space (PROS) Master Plan survey is now live. The survey can be taken by visiting togetherweplaykyle.com and will collect feedback regarding parks, recreation, trails, programs, events, and the sports complex.

Parks and Recreation, along with Stantec our consultant, will be gathering public input from the community over the next several weeks via the online surveys as well as in-person during community event "pop-ups" to collect information and explain more about the project. Additionally, we will be hosting two public workshops for interactive input and design charrettes.




III. INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT UPDATES

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank & Pump Station:

- GST contractor is continuing to install decking on dome.
 Concrete placement is pushed to October 29th.
- Archer Western has placed environmental controls at the Well Site #4 and locates for existing lines have been completed. Project sign has been ordered for this site.



- Archer Western and Preload work schedules 7:00 am- 4:30 pm, Mon-Fri.
- Cost for Phase 2 of the project has been submitted and is currently under review.

Alliance Pipeline Construction Updates:

- Crew A relocated to the south, laying pipe to the east and south of CR158, expected to lay 3,000 feet of pipe.
- Crew B continues laying pipe to the south towards Hwy 150, expected to lay 3,000 feet of pipe.
- Crew C new crew starting work; will start by pushing the pipe under I-35 through the tunnel south of Beebee Road, then lay pipe to the west of Bunton Branch Creek. Coordination on-going with City contractor on Marketplace Avenue extension.
- Finish microtunnel near Waterstone and relocate machine for final tunnel under U.P. Railroad near Kohler's Crossing
- Hand tunnelling for various crossings will continue
- Contractor has informed us that they do not expect to be able to meet the completion of Lines 1, 3 and 4 by February 28, 2025. This is because of delays in acquiring access / right to construct across several parcels, including the Lehman Roadway extension (Bunton Creek to Dacy Lane) and Northpoint Austin Industries. ARWA is working closely with the contractor to determine ways to mitigate any delays. Agreements have been reached between ARWA and the landowners for the majority of the remaining easements needed, the lone exception is the parcel on the north side of Bunton Creek that is being acquired by the City.

OCTOBER 25, 2024

Plum Creek Retail Roads:

- Water line placement is complete on Avenue A.
- Duct bank steel casing bored on Avenue A.
- Reclaim water line boring in progress on Avenue A.
- Storm drain placement planned this week along Cromwell.



La Verde Park Parking Lot:

- Project is 80% complete.
- The remaining work is landscaping and light installation.


