III. INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT UPDATES

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank & Pump Station:

- Progress continues on the installation of the GST 16-inch outlet line.
- Coordination on the Marketplace Ave improvements and future 3-inch force main wastewater line continues.



- Full onsite mobilization of Preload, GST contractor, is pushed to September 3, after Labor Day holiday. Final completion date is not affected.
- Archer Westernwork schedule 6am-4:30pm, Monday- Friday.



Plum Creek Retail Roads:

- Storm drain placement is in progress along Avenue A between FM 1626 and Everett.
- Duct bank placement has started along Avenue A between FM 1626 and Everett.
- Irrigation relocation at PAC to be completed this week along Cromwell between Avenue A and Doherty.
- The contractor is approximately 20% complete.

MicroSurfacing:



- Microsurface installation is completed.
- Cleanup and striping is in progress.

Pothole Repair:



Since August 9, 30 potholes have been repaired, with a total of 811 in 2024.

Roland Lane:

- Project Started August 12 and was completed August 30.
- Project Scope included Full-Depth Mill and Overlay of .57 Ln Miles from Garner Dr to S. Main St.
- Striping will commence soon, weather permitting.





Hallie Drive - Sidewalk Project:

- Project Started August 5 and was completed August 26.
- Project Scope included installing 740 LF of new sidewalk on the south side of Hallie from Lehman Dr to Steeplechase Park.
- Installation of the new sidewalk was based on feedback received from the public during the Sidewalk Masterplan Open House

La Verde Park Parking Lot:

- Per pay requests, project is 19.5% completed.
- Backfilled storm drain line.
- Completed density test for storm drain line.
- Installed irrigation sleeves within the parking lot area.
- The dry utility crew installed conduits for lights in the parking lot area.
- Blade crew mobilized and subgrade preparation started.
- Base course installation is planned for this week.
- No weather delays







Spring Branch Drainage Maintenance:

 From August 13-16, Drainage Maintenance Crews installed bull-rock in the Spring Branch ditch to mitigate erosion and maintain adequate drainage.
