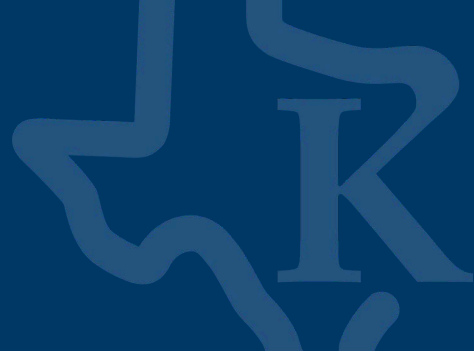

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Executive Summary

Pool season officially opened May 23, beginning summer aquatic operations and programming at James Adkins Pool.

Water infrastructure projects continued progressing this week. At the FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station, crews advanced sidewalk work, pump valve assembly, electrical wiring, fire alarm and heat sensor installation, door hardware, and pump balancing. Work also continued at Well Site #4 and the County Road 158 Ground Storage Tanks, including electrical conduit, pump controls, backfill, storm drain excavation, communication equipment, tank sandblasting, and interior coating.

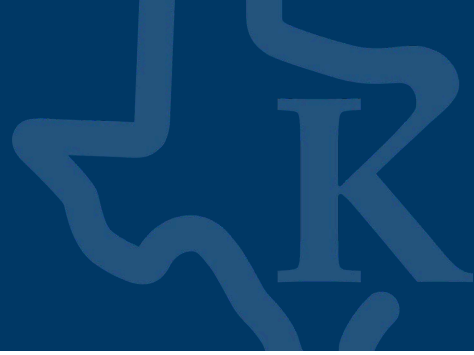
Wastewater and site restoration projects remained active across the city. At Center Street Village, crews continued pipe, manhole, and bored utility crossing work under Interstate 35, with additional work planned as weather allows. At Plum Creek Golf Course, crews continued restoring the staging area and shaping the drainage channel with concrete.

Construction also continued at major community facilities. The Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark advanced with pump track work, shotcrete, reinforcing steel, and preparation for underground electrical wiring. The Kyle Community Center continued moving through interior finishes, building systems, drainage improvements, irrigation revisions, and remaining accessibility work.

Several 2022 Road Bond projects moved forward through construction and design. Kohlers to Seton, Bebee Road West, Windy Hill Road, and Center Street West remain active, with work focused on roadway embankment, drainage infrastructure, utility coordination, widening activities, and construction mobilization. Other corridors, including Bunton Creek Road, Kyle Parkway/Lehman Extension, Old Stagecoach Road, and Center Street East, continue through final design, utility coordination, right-of-way work, and upcoming submittals.

Parks and Recreation hosted the City's Memorial Day ceremony at Heroes Memorial Park in partnership with Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 12058, AMVETS, and the Ladies Auxiliary, with more than 200 community members attending. The department also marked World Bee Day with a native plant handout on May 20 and opened pool season on May 23, beginning summer aquatic operations and programming for residents of all ages and abilities.

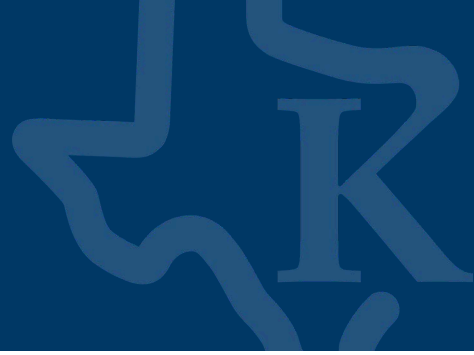

Infrastructure and Project Updates

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station

Staff Contact: Mike Murphy

Crews continued construction at the Farm-to-Market 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station, including sidewalk work, pump valve assembly, site cleanup, electrical wiring, exterior light conduit, fire alarm and heat sensor installation, and pump control and flow meter connections. Door hardware installation and pump balancing also continued, while ceiling work in the electrical room remains pending material delivery.



Well Site #4 (La Verde)

Work continued at Well Site #4 with electrical conduit installation for the fire alarm system and heat sensors in the pump station and chlorine building. Crews also continued installing pump controls, placed backfill for the west discharge line, and began excavation for a storm drain manhole.



CR 158 Ground Storage Tanks

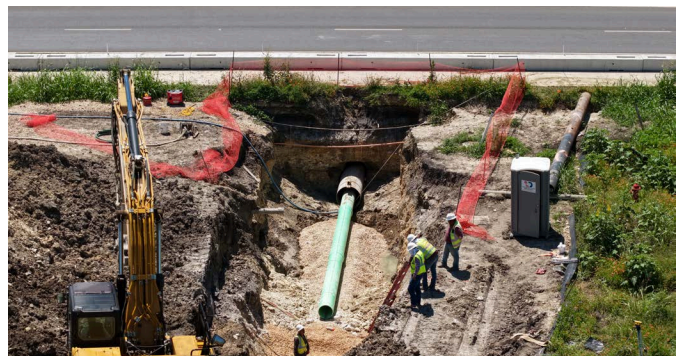
Work continued at the County Road 158 Ground Storage Tanks, including wiring in the chlorine storage building, communication panel installation in the booster pump building, and conduit installation for communication equipment. Crews also adjusted the Alamito Avenue entrance gate, continued sandblasting inside the elevated storage tank, and continued applying interior tank coatings.



Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement

Last week, crews completed wastewater pipe work on the west side of Farm-to-Market 150 and continued installing pipe, manholes, and bored utility crossings under Interstate 35. This week, crews are expected to continue pipe and manhole installation as weather conditions allow.





Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

Last week, crews continued site restoration, cleaned up the staging area, and placed concrete to shape the drainage channel. This week, restoration work and drainage channel improvements are expected to continue, weather permitting.



Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark

Crews poured concrete foundations for future light poles and continued pump track work, including formwork, reinforcing steel, shotcrete application, shaping, and curing. This week, crews are expected to continue pump track and street plaza construction, while electrical crews begin underground wiring for future lighting and lift station equipment.



Kyle Community Center

Last week, construction continued at the Kyle Community Center with interior finishes, ceiling installation, electrical work, security system pathways, movable partitions, and fire suppression preparations. Crews also installed the rooftop air conditioning unit, and this week work is expected to continue on interior finishes, building systems, drainage improvements, irrigation revisions, and remaining accessibility features.

Kohlers to Seton

Kohlers to Seton Extension (I-35 to Seton Pkwy) **Stage: Construction**

Construction continues along the Kohlers corridor between the IH-35 northbound frontage road and Seton Parkway, with work focused on corridor-specific roadway and infrastructure improvements. Ongoing activities include utility coordination and relocations, stormwater detention pond excavation, retaining wall construction, roadway embankment work, and continued installation of roadway illumination drill shaft foundations along Kohlers from IH-35 to the roundabout. Additional work includes curb and gutter installation from the roundabout toward Seton/Bridge, sidewalk installation from the roundabout to Bebee Road, construction of the IH-35 northbound frontage road Kohlers Crossing right-turn lane, and waterline installation from Bebee Road to the proposed Bunton Branch Creek. PEC duct bank installation between IH-35 and the roundabout has also progressed, along with retaining wall waterproofing and structural work at Bunton Branch Creek.



Kohlers to Seton Underpass (I-35) **Stage: Early Design**

The schematic design remains at 90% completion. The updated Intersection Control Evaluation report was sent to TxDOT the week of May 11, 2026 and is currently under agency review. The 100% revised schematic submitted on February 11, 2026 remains part of the same TxDOT review process.

2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)

Bebee Rd

Bebee Road (West)

Stage: Construction

Construction on Bebee Road (West) continues along the future alignment between Republic Drive and Dacy Lane, with activities focused specifically on roadway development within the Bebee segment. Ongoing work includes roadway embankment construction, stormwater drainage pipe installation, utility coordination, and continued preparation of roadway base and pavement structure along the future Bebee alignment.

Recent progress includes completion of roadway embankment and stormwater drainage culvert installation along the future Bebee Road alignment from Republic Drive to the proposed Kohlers Crossing/Bebbee Road roundabout. Additional ongoing activities include drainage infrastructure improvements and support work associated with future retaining wall and utility integration.

Upcoming work will focus on Bebee roadway improvements between existing Bebee Road and Republic Drive, including base courses, curb and gutter installation, sidewalk construction, temporary shoefly traffic alignment work, and drainage stabilization using 24-inch rock riprap along the corridor.

Bebee Road (East)

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 95% completion. The final 100% PS&E schedule is still being updated based on the tie-in location change, and the previously planned roundabout at Bebee Road and North Goforth Road has been removed from the project scope.

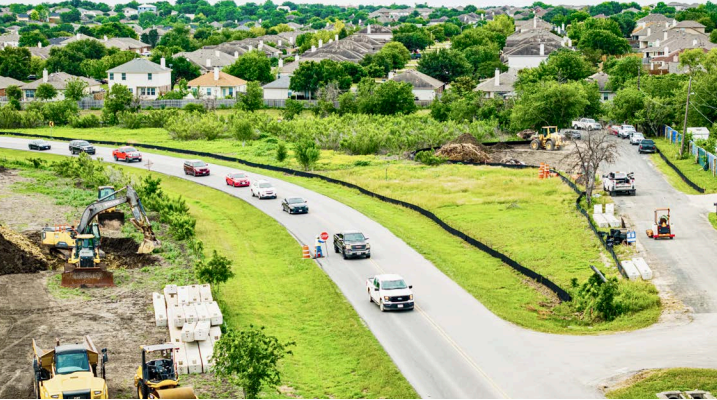

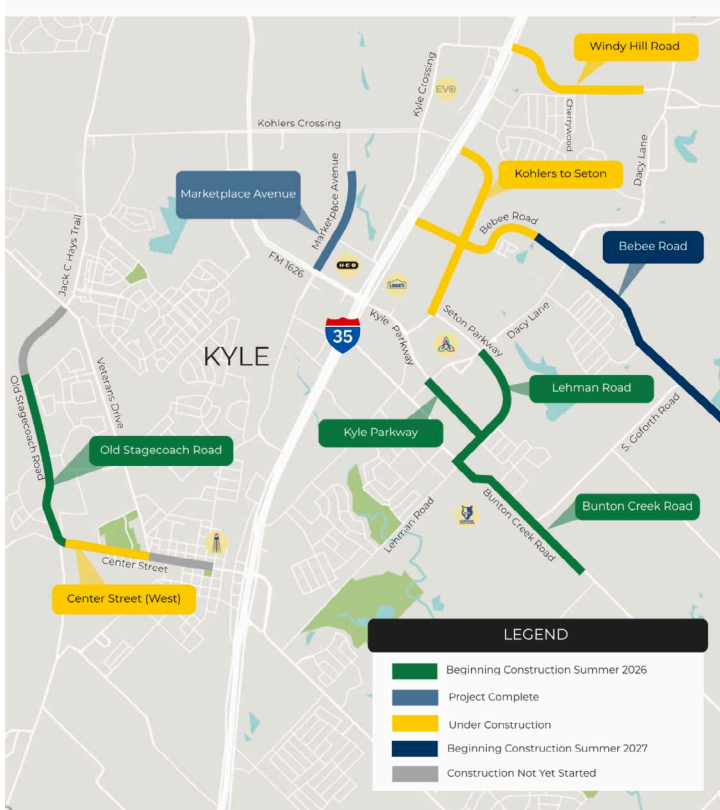
Windy Hill Rd

Stage: Construction

The project continues advancing through early construction activities following Notice to Proceed issued May 11, 2026. Ongoing work includes a two-lane, one-way flagging operation to support eastbound widening activities, Phase 1A roadway widening operations, and grading within the new Windy Hill roadway footprint.

Old Stagecoach Rd

Old Stagecoach Road North Stage: Final Design

The 100% final PS&E plans submitted March 24, 2026 remain dependent on Jack C Hays and final PEC plans. The project is planned to be let with Jack C Hays (FM2770), and right-of-way is expected to complete the eminent domain process by July 30, 2026.

Old Stagecoach Road Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 95% completion, with the 100% PS&E submittal scheduled for June 1, 2026. Right-of-way for roadway improvements is clear, and utility relocation is expected to begin in Summer 2026.

Center Street (West Segment) Stage: Construction

The project continues advancing toward construction mobilization. The contractor received the executed schedule on May 22, 2026, and the pre-construction meeting is scheduled for June 4, 2026. Notice to Proceed will be determined during the pre-construction meeting, and the baseline schedule is due June 5, 2026. Utility relocation is expected to begin in Summer 2026.

Bunton Creek Rd

Stage: Final Design

Draft bid plans received May 15, 2026 are being coordinated with PEC for review. Bid advertising is planned for June 2026, and right-of-way is expected to be clear by May 30, 2026. Coordination with PEC and Countyline Waterline continues.

Kyle Pkwy/Lehman Ext.

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 95% completion. Water and wastewater comment resolution meetings were completed May 19, 2026, and the drainage comment resolution meeting was completed May 13, 2026. Final plans are due June 16, 2026. AT&T utility relocation activities are underway, and additional drainage and PEC easement parcel documentation remains in progress.

Center Street

Center Street (East Segment, on TxDOT System)

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 55% completion. The 60% PS&E submittal is scheduled for September 14, 2026, and PEC surveys are expected by June 18, 2026. The TxDOT Review and Technical Coordination meeting remains to be determined.

Marketplace Ave

Stage: Completed

Construction reached 100% completion. As-built plans have been accepted, and the City has assumed maintenance responsibilities for the corridor.

Memorial Day serves as a solemn reminder of the men and women who gave their lives in service to the nation.

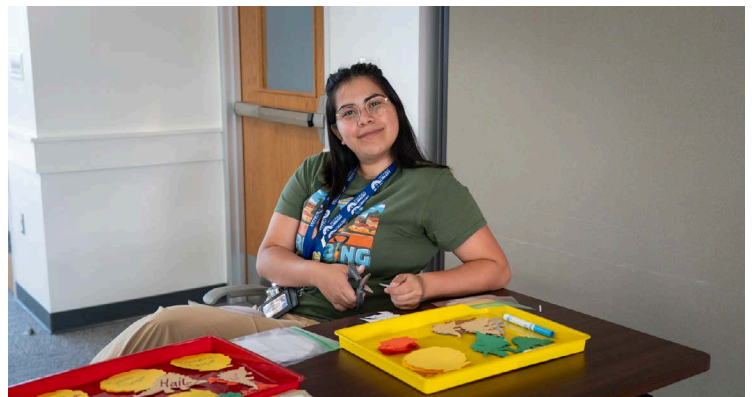


KPL Dig Into Reading Summer Kickoff!

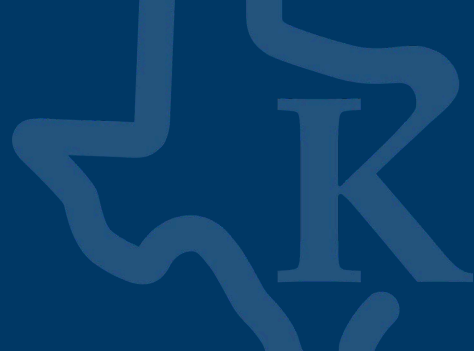

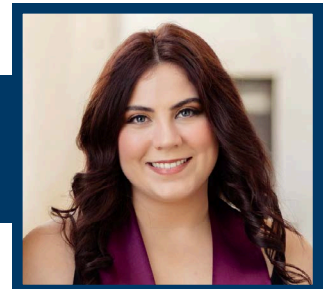
