Executive Summary

The City of Kyle

Design and construction activity continued across several 2022 Road Bond projects. Marketplace Avenue reached substantial completion, with lighting systems activated and final site restoration underway ahead of project closeout. Design progress advanced on multiple corridors, including Bunton Creek Road, Old Stagecoach Road, and Center Street, while Windy Hill Road moved closer to advertisement for construction.

Utility and wastewater projects also saw steady progress. Crews continued pipe installation on the Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line, and engineers revised plans for the Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement to avoid fiber conflicts. Work advanced on Schlemmer and Porter Wastewater Phase 3, as well as at Well Site #4 and the FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station, where building and electrical installations are underway.

In neighborhood infrastructure, ADA curb ramp construction continued in Amberwood, remaining on track for December completion. Lighting maintenance at Gregg-Clarke Park improved evening visibility for field use, while the Conservation Team completed native planting enhancements at Steeplechase Playground to support local habitat and long-term sustainability.

The Parks and Recreation Department held a ribbon cutting on October 31 for the new Waterleaf Park playground. The event featured remarks from Council Member Miguel Zuniga, Mayor Pro Tem Bear Heiser, and Parks Board Member Holly Wilson, along with community participation, refreshments from Whirlix and ForeverLawn, and outreach from the Hays County Chapter of the Texas Master Naturalists.

The City's Communications Department received 14 awards at the 2025 Texas Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (TATOA) Conference, including the top honor of Best Overall. The recognition highlights the City's growing excellence in creative, informative, and community-focused communications.

Infrastructure and Project Updates

Schlemmer & Porter Wastewater Improvements Phase 3

Staff Contact: Mike Murphy

Water and wastewater line installation is ongoing along Schlemmer under active lane controls. The contractor remains on schedule.



Plum Creek Retail Roads Updates

Tree and plant installation is complete, and a walkthrough took place October 31. Bollards and street furniture are being installed, with street lights scheduled for activation following electric-meter inspection. Custom lighting fabrication remains delayed.



FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station

The 16-inch discharge valve was installed, and pipe supports were poured for the discharge line. Crews are building pump-station walls and setting conduit for the permanent generator.



Well Site #4 (La Verde)

Backfill is complete at the generator pad, and roof, ductwork, louvers, and door installations are in progress at the pump building. Interior finishes will follow.



Infrastructure and Project Updates



CR 158 Elevated & Ground Storage Tank

Leaks on the ARWA tie-in were resolved by replacing flange connectors. Conduit installation continues at the booster pump station, and stairway and handrail work is progressing on the elevated tank. The survey package is being submitted to the electric provider to finalize the power-easement process.



Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

Crews continued installing 30-inch pipe and set an additional manhole last week. Erosion control is underway north of Sampson Street in preparation for the 36-inch bore under Sampson.



Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement

AT&T's survey identified fiber lines that conflict with the planned wastewater alignment. Engineers are revising plan sets to avoid the fiber before construction resumes.



Lighting Enhancements at Gregg-Clarke Park

The Park Maintenance team serviced the soccer field lighting at Gregg-Clarke Park by replacing burnt-out bulbs and ballasts, improving brightness and visibility for evening activities. While future upgrades may be planned, ongoing maintenance is essential for ensuring safety and reliability for players, coaches, and visitors.

Kohlers to Seton

Kohlers to Seton - Construction

Construction continues along the Kohlers to Seton corridor. Crews are advancing on roadway and drainage work near Kohlers Crossing and the IH-35 northbound frontage road. Current activities include storm drain installation, utility coordination, and embankment work to support future pavement placement.

Kohlers to Seton (IH-35 at Kohlers Crossing) - Early-stage Design

The schematic design for the IH-35 underpass remains under TxDOT review. The review will verify compliance with state highway design standards and guide the transition into final design.

Bebee Rd

Bebee Road (West) - Construction

Construction activities remain coordinated with the Kohlers-to-Seton corridor improvements, focusing on drainage infrastructure and bridge preparation at Bunton Branch. Utility relocations are underway to clear conflicts before major bridge construction begins.

Bebee Road (East) - Final Design

90% PS&E review was completed on October 31, 2025. A comment-resolution meeting is scheduled for this week to address remaining design items before the project advances toward its final PS&E milestone.

2022 Road Bonds Update (Cont)

Old Stagecoach Rd

Old Stagecoach Road North - Final Design

90% PS&E submission is scheduled for November 14, 2025. Design work focuses on integrating roadway and drainage refinements and developing the planned roundabout at Six Creeks. Right-of-way coordination is ongoing to secure property needed for the widening.

Old Stagecoach Road - Final Design

The design team is preparing for the 95% PS&E submittal due in late December. Utility relocation and design for PEC civil work was approved on October 21, 2025.

Center Street (West Segment)

- Final Design

Design progress continues toward completion, with 95% PS&E submitted on October 28, 2025. Utility relocation is expected to begin December 1, 2025.

Center Street

Center Street (East Segment)

- Final Design

Design coordination continues as the team works toward 60% PS&E which is expected December 17, 2025.

Bunton Creek Rd

Bunton Creek Road - Final Design

The design team is finalizing 100% PS&E package for submission on November 13, 2025. Current efforts focus on incorporating review comments and completing PEC and telecommunications coordination. Right-of-way offers are in progress.

Windy Hill Rd

Windy Hill Road - Final Design

100% bid-ready plans were submitted on October 15, 2025, and are currently under review. Once complete, the project will move toward construction advertisement.

Kyle Pkwy/Lehman Ext.

Kyle Parkway/Lehman Road Extension - Final Design

Final PS&E design updates have been completed, and the project is preparing for transition into the construction phase. Bidready plans are anticipated on November 7, 2025.

Marketplace Ave

Marketplace Avenue - Substantial Completion

Marketplace Avenue construction is nearly complete. Street-lighting systems are now active with automatic shutoff controls, and trail lighting activation occured on November 5, 2025, enhancing pedestrian safety and nighttime visibility. Final grading and mowing have been completed, and site restoration near Levy's area is underway. A final punch-list walkthrough will follow, marking one of the last steps before full project closeout.

Programs and Service Updates

Conservation Begins Steeplechase Native Species Installation

The Conservation Team enhanced the Steeplechase Playground by planting native trees and ornamental beds. Fall and winter are optimal for planting due to cooler temperatures aiding root development. These native species will provide shade, support wildlife, improve soil health, and strengthen the ecosystem, aligning with the city's commitment to sustainable park design.

Monarch Waystation Workshop

On November 1, the Conservation Department held a Monarch Waystation workshop at the community garden to educate and encourage others to plant monarch waystations at their private residences. The Native Landscape Supervisor shared information before showing the group how to install the plants to bring the most monarchs. Participants took home nectar-rich plants and Milkweeds.





Waterleaf Playground Ribbon Cutting

The Parks and Recreation Department hosted a ribbon cutting on October 31 to celebrate the new playground at Waterleaf Park. Council Member Miguel Zuniga, Mayor Pro Tem Bear Heiser, and Parks Board Member Holly Wilson offered brief remarks before the ribbon was cut. Whirlix and ForeverLawn provided bbq sandwiches for attendees, and a Texas Master Naturalist from the Hays County Chapter hosted an informational booth on local wildlife and conservation. The event had a festive atmosphere, with many attendees in costume and candy handed out to children.













City of Kyle Open Data Policy Update

The citywide Open Data Policy Project is advancing as part of the city's broader transparency and accountability initiative. The project began mid 2025 with the framework of open data and information sharing policies, including the listing of ALPR and drone program policy details. In response to growing public interest and council direction, the city has developed a phased approach. The first phase focuses on publishing existing policy, data, and reporting materials, which was completed in September 2025, while the second phase will engage a third-party consultant to audit data practices and draft a comprehensive data policy citywide. That draft was presented to Kyle City Council for feedback on October 21, 2025, where members emphasized accessibility, privacy safeguards, and departmental consistency.

Building on that discussion, the Kyle Police Department has developed a transparency page on its website to host current policies, including those related to drones and other public safety technologies, along with relevant data for community review. This effort aligns with council's request as well as hosting an open house event tied to the Drone as a First Responder (DFR) Program, planned for spring 2026, offering residents an opportunity to learn firsthand about police technology and accountability measures. Looking ahead, the city will award an RFP in early 2026 to formalize the comprehensive, citywide data policy, a long-term framework designed to govern data sharing, privacy standards, and public transparency across all departments.


