# **Executive Summary**

Final plans for the Kyle
Parkway and Lehman
Road Extension were
submitted on November
10, completing the
design phase and
preparing the project to
move into bidding.

Construction progressed at multiple utility sites, including Well Site 4, the FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank, and the CR 158 Elevated and Ground Storage Tank, where crews focused on structural work, roofing, conduit installation, and electrical connections. Work also moved forward on the Wastewater Treatment Plant expansion, with the contractor now on site under the Early Works Package.

Wastewater improvements remained active across several corridors. Crews continued installing 30-inch sewer pipe at the Plum Creek Golf Course, added erosion control near Sampson Street, and revised plans for the Center Street Village project after AT&T completed its utility survey. Installation of water and wastewater lines at Schlemmer and Porter also stayed on schedule.

Transportation projects advanced with ongoing safety reviews and planned improvements along Dacy Lane near Chapa Middle School. Traffic counts were collected earlier this month, and crews will add rumble strips and new "SCHOOL" pavement markings over the coming weeks. Engineers expect to complete their analysis in early December, which will guide future crossing and lighting upgrades between Bebee Road and Windy Hill Road.

Road Bond construction continued across the Kohlers to Seton and Bebee Road corridors, with crews building embankments, installing drainage systems, and preparing for upcoming bridge work.

The City is also moving the heritage live oak as part of the Old Stagecoach Road improvements. Crews have excavated around the tree, built a support platform, and prepared it for relocation. Updated road closures associated with this work are scheduled for early December.

Community programs remained active through Parks and Recreation, including Jams on the Green, Texas Arbor Day tree distribution, the Central Region TRAPS Workshop, and inclusive recreation activities. The annual Veterans Day Parade brought strong participation with 22 floats and highlighted local veterans, community groups, and City staff.

# Infrastructure and Project Updates

# Schlemmer & Porter Wastewater Improvements Phase 3

The contractor remains on schedule while continuing installation of water and wastewater lines along Schlemmer. Work is progressing steadily despite ongoing utility coordination needs.



### **Plum Creek Retail Roads Updates**

Tree and plant installation is complete, and a walkthrough took place October 31. Bollards and street furniture are being installed, with street lights scheduled for activation following electric-meter inspection. Custom lighting fabrication remains delayed.



# FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station

Crews installed a 16 inch valve on the main water line and are backfilling the trench around it. Support work for pipes on the west side of the pump building is complete, and walls for the pump station are being built. Electricians are installing conduit that will connect the site to a permanent generator and the PEC power transformer.



## Well Site #4 (La Verde)

The contractor poured the concrete pad for the emergency generator this week. Crews are putting the metal roof on the pump building and installing heaters, fans, and exterior doors. These steps move the building closer to being fully enclosed so interior equipment can be added.

# **CR 158 Elevated & Ground Storage Tank**

Work continues on the ground storage tank, where crews are installing handrails and preparing trenches for wiring and fiber conduit. Structural framing on the elevated tank is progressing, and the scaffold is being lowered so the stairway can be installed. Electricians are connecting wiring at the booster pump building and generator, and the site survey has been submitted to PEC to support the power easement. Kinder Morgan is finalizing its approval for the electrical duct bank to cross its gas pipeline.



#### Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

SkyBlue Utilities continued installing 30-inch sewer pipe and set another manhole last week. Crews will install several hundred more feet of pipe and an additional manhole this week, and are placing erosion control north of Sampson Street for the upcoming 36inch bore under Sampson.



### **Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement**

AT&T completed a utility survey, and the engineer is revising plans to avoid a buried fiber line that conflicts with the current alignment. Updated plan sets will be developed before construction resumes.



## **Wastewater Treatment Plant -Early Works Package**

The City awarded the early construction package for the wastewater treatment plant expansion, and the contractor has started preparing the site. Access to the project will come from Heidenreich Lane. This phase of work is scheduled to continue through November 2026.

# Dacy Lane Safety Review and Improvements




During the week of November 3, staff collected traffic counts along Dacy Lane near Chapa Middle School to determine whether a traffic signal or pedestrian beacon is needed.

Between November 17 and November 24, crews will place rumble strips in both directions, followed by new "SCHOOL" pavement markings during the week of November 24.

Engineers will complete the full traffic analysis by the week of December 8 and will determine next steps, including whether overhead school zone flashers are appropriate.

Over the next 6 to 10 months, the City will move into design and construction for any required crossing devices and will complete a study on the potential for added roadway lighting from Bebee Road to Windy Hill Road.

#### **Kohlers to Seton**

#### **Kohlers to Seton - Construction**

Construction along the Kohlers to Seton corridor continues to progress. Crews are building embankments and installing stormwater drainage culverts along the future Bebee Road alignment, while utility work advances along the IH-35 northbound frontage road in preparation for a new right-turn lane at Kohlers Crossing. Additional work includes detention pond excavation, wastewater improvements, and retaining wall construction. Right-of-way clearing is also underway to prepare for upcoming bridge and roadway work. In the coming weeks, crews will continue pond excavation, embankment construction, and drainage pipe installation.

# Kohlers to Seton (IH-35 at Kohlers Crossing) - Early-stage Design

TxDOT continues its review of the schematic design for the IH-35 underpass at Kohlers Crossing. TxDOT's schematic review ensures the design meets state highway standards before the project can move into the final design stage.

#### **Bebee Rd**

#### **Bebee Road (West) - Construction**

Construction on Bebee Road (West) continues in coordination with the Kohlers/Bebee corridor. Crews are installing stormwater drainage culverts and constructing roadway embankments leading to the future Kohlers Crossing/Bebee Road roundabout. Work also includes excavation of the stormwater detention pond, ground clearing along the new roadway alignment, and removal of existing fencing. Upcoming work includes continued pond excavation, roadway base placement, and additional right-of-way clearing to support future bridge construction over Bunton Branch.

#### Bebee Road (East) - Final Design

Bebee Road (East) is entering its final design phase. The 100 % PS&E (Plans, Specifications, and Estimates—the full engineering documents required for bidding and construction) is due on December 22, 2025.

# 2022 Road Bonds Update (Cont)

#### **Old Stagecoach Rd**

#### Old Stagecoach Road North - Final Design

The 90 % PS&E submittal is due November 14, 2025. Current work includes finalizing roadway and drainage revisions and preparing the layout for the Six Creeks roundabout. Offer letters have been sent to all but one property owner, an important step toward advancing the corridor to construction readiness.

#### Old Stagecoach Road - Final Design

The 95 % PS&E is due December 23, 2025. Non-joint-bid utility relocations are progressing, with right-of-way coordination already tracking as cleared.

#### **Center Street (West Segment)**

#### - Final Design

The 95 % PS&E was submitted on October 28, 2025, and is under review. Utility relocations are anticipated to begin in December 2025.

#### **Center Street**

#### **Center Street (East Segment)**

#### - Final Design

The design team is advancing work toward the next PS&E milestone by addressing comments received during TxDOT's review of the 30 percent PS&E.

#### **Bunton Creek Rd**

#### **Bunton Creek Road - Final Design**

The final 100 % PS&E package is due November 13, 2025. Current efforts focus on incorporating final comments, updating the project manual, and completing coordination related to telecom utilities and PEC. Offer letters have been sent to property owners and are under negotiation.

#### Windy Hill Rd

#### Windy Hill Road - Final Design

Right-of-way acquisition is active as the project approaches the bidding phase. Bid advertising is anticipated to begin in December 2025. Updated civil plans have been sent to PEC for review.

# Kyle Parkway/Lehman Road Extension - Final Design

Final PS&E documents were submitted on November 10, 2025, marking completion of the design phase. With final PS&E submitted, the project is now preparing to transition into bidding.

## Marketplace Ave

#### **Marketplace Avenue**

#### - Substantial Completion

Marketplace Avenue is nearing full completion. Street-lighting systems are active with automatic shutoff controls, and Vybe trail lighting is operational. The pedestrian rectangular rapid flashing beacon (RFB) will be operational November 14. Final grading and mowing have been completed, and site restoration near the Levy's area is underway. Once final site impacts are cleared, the project will proceed to its punch-list walkthrough, one of the last steps before close-out.

# Heritage Oak Tree Move: Timeline Update

The City of Kyle continues its effort to preserve an important piece of the community's heritage through the relocation of the Old Stagecoach Tree, a live oak that has long been part of the local landscape.

On Monday, November 3, crews began the careful relocation process. They have removed sections of Old Stagecoach Road, excavated around the tree's root ball, and built a support platform to safely hold the tree while out of the ground. Next, the tree will be rolled out of its extraction hole, prepared for transport, lifted onto a self-propelled modular transporter and transported to its new location approximately a quarter mile northwest.

The expanded closure of Old Stagecoach Road from Cypress Forest Drive to Six Creeks Boulevard to move the tree to its location has been rescheduled. The new closure dates are December 2–10, moved earlier from the originally planned December 8–20 timeframe. During this period, traffic will be detoured along Cypress Forest Drive to Allegheny Way to Cold River Run to Rio Blanco Way to Six Creeks Boulevard.
