Executive Summary

The City, joined by 300 community members, celebrated the opening of the renovated Steeplechase Playground, which now provides ADA-compliant access and inclusive play features.

Several infrastructure projects advanced this week despite ongoing challenges. At the CR 158 elevated and ground storage tank site, contractors are preparing for a concrete pour on Level 9 of the elevated tank while easement discussions for long-term access continue. Work also continues at the FM 1626 pump station and chlorine building, along with coordination for a future railroad crossing.

Wastewater improvements progressed at multiple locations. Crews at Schlemmer & Porter encountered harder rock than anticipated and nearby utilities, slowing trenching but keeping the overall schedule intact. SkyBlue advanced installation of the Plum Creek Golf Course sewer line, while Center Street Village planning was temporarily delayed pending updated utility information.

Final close-out activities are underway at Gregg and Ranger Drives, with pavement repairs scheduled. At the Wastewater Treatment Plant access road, drainage work and gate installation are complete, and a new electronic security system is being added. Road bond design reviews remain on track, with several submittals scheduled for September and October.

The city's AMI smart meter program has converted 4,661 meters since May, with crews moving into the Plum Creek subdivision next week. In Parks and Recreation, nearly 300 residents attended the Steeplechase Playground ribbon cutting, which celebrated the installation of accessible play features shaped by community input. Staff also advanced conservation work, including new native landscaping partnerships and certification achievements in aquatics management.

Infrastructure and Project Updates

Schlemmer & Porter Wastewater Improvements Phase 3

Contractors encountered harder rock than anticipated, along with close proximity to existing utilities, which has slowed trenching. Despite these challenges, work continues as planned, and the project team is working to maintain the overall schedule for this phase of improvements.



Plum Creek Retail Roads Updates

Contractors are addressing punch list items for curb-tocurb roadway improvements, with a walkthrough on September 3. Work behind the curb will continue into October, including light pole and bollard installation as well as tree and plantings once cooler weather improves survivability.



FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank & Pump Station

Concrete placement continues on the pump building's trench walls, while block work advances on the chlorine building at Well Site #4. Crews are also installing underground conduits to power the pump systems. Coordination with Union Pacific Railroad is ongoing for a future bore that will connect to the FM 1626 Transmission Main.



CR 158 Elevated & Ground Storage Tank

Work continues on multiple fronts at the site. PROTA is assisting with placement of roof trusses on the Booster Pump Building ahead of the upcoming roof installation. Landmark has scheduled the next concrete pour for Level 9 of the elevated tank, leaving nine levels to complete the structure. Easement discussions with Lennar remain underway for long-term site access from CR 158.



Infrastructure and Project Updates



Waste Water Treatment Plant Access Road

Crews are finishing drainage ditches, concrete work, and site clean-up. Entrance gates have been installed, and work has begun on the new electronic security system, which will take several weeks to complete and will enhance monitoring and access control for the facility.



Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

SkyBlue Utilities installed several hundred feet of 30-inch sewer pipe and added stormwater controls to prevent runoff from spoil piles entering a nearby pond. Crews will advance another 150 feet of pipe this week through rocky clay soils, which continue to slow progress. Installation of Manhole 7 is scheduled to follow.



Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement

Joe Bland Construction completed additional surveying to assess conflicts with existing utilities. AT&T is expected to provide updated line information, which the engineering team will use to revise the pipe alignment. All project partners will meet onsite to determine the best path forward once the data is finalized.

Contractors completed seeding, asphalt patching, and restriping along the corridor, with additional pavement repairs scheduled. These final activities address remaining issues before the project is fully closed out.

Infrastructure and Project Updates

2022 Road Bond Update

Road bond projects continue to move forward with design reviews, right-of-way coordination, and utility planning. Several PS&E submissions are on track for September and October, including Bebee Road (East), Old Stagecoach Road, and Center Street. No new major construction milestones were reached this week, but multiple projects remain on schedule for upcoming reviews and approvals.



AMI Smart Meter Installation Update

Since May 2025, 4,661 meters and radios have been converted to the advanced metering system. Crews will continue installations in Hometown Kyle and begin work in the Plum Creek subdivision during the week of September 8.



Steeplechase Playground Ribbon Cutting

On Friday, August 29, the Parks and Recreation Department welcomed nearly 300 residents to celebrate the grand opening of the newly renovated Steeplechase Playground at 295 Hallie Drive. The event offered more than brief remarks—it was lively and inclusive, with food, music, and family-friendly fun. Attendees enjoyed BBQ sandwiches, popsicles, and creative play with a bubble and chalk art zone thanks to the generous support of Texas Children's Pediatrics, ForeverLawn, and Whirlix.

The new playground is the result of community-driven design and modern accessibility standards. In February 2025, over 500 residents provided feedback on three inclusive playground concepts, choosing the "modern concept" that emphasized sensory, cognitive, and physical development. The playground now features ADA-compliant ramps, accessible sidewalks and surfacing, shaded areas, additional seating, and inclusive play elements—all aimed at ensuring safe and engaging play for children of all abilities.

This ribbon-cutting marks a milestone in the city's commitment to inclusive, thoughtful recreation. By integrating public input and prioritizing accessibility, the Parks and Recreation Department continues to make Kyle's parks more welcoming and equitable for children and families.

Aquatics Coordinator Earns National Splash Pad Certification


