### III. FERAL HOG UPDATE

**Last week: April 1 - 4, 2025:** Lately, recordings have reported only occasional sightings of hogs in passing, indicating relatively subdued activity. As a result, both traps being utilized were moved to new locations to attempt to capture the remaining sounders.

**This week: April 7 - 11, 2025:** Traps are baited and monitored in new locations. Parks and Recreation Conservation team will continue to gather additional data on the level of hog activity in those areas.

**Next steps:** The Conservation team will consult with the trapper to evaluate the possibility of scaling back trapping efforts based on this week's data.

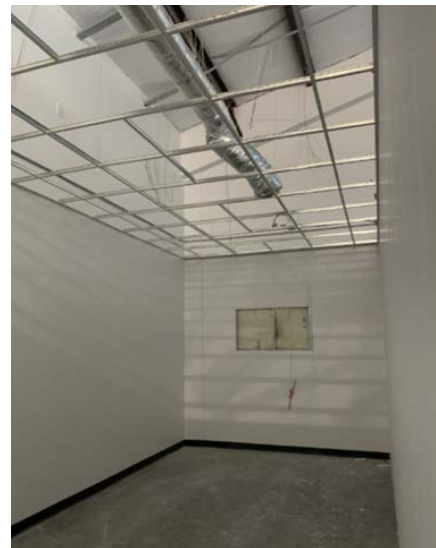
### La Verde Park Event Lawn – Maintenance Closure

Work began on March 1, 2025, and included aeration, leveling, overseeding, and fertilization, completed by April 5. The lawn will remain closed for up to six weeks for recovery, and the community is asked to avoid walking on it during this period. Updates on reopening will be provided as progress is made.

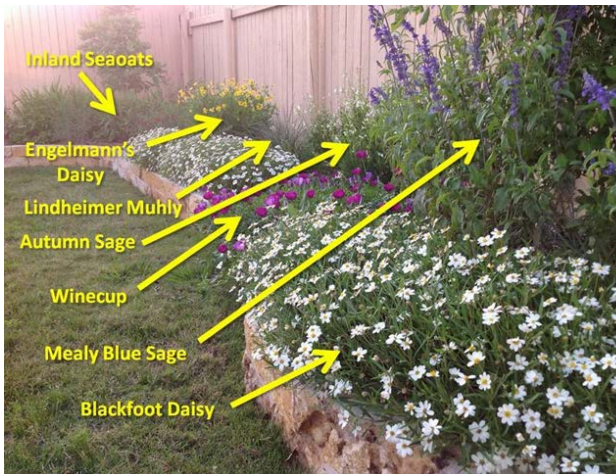


### Republic Drive Interior Renovation

Meetings focused on improving pool operations, exploring shade options, and technology upgrades. Facility updates included repairs by Oasis and a walkthrough by the City of Kyle technician. A key highlight was onboarding 22 new lifeguards and welcoming pool managers.

## V. KYLE/KOHLERS CROSSING SIGNAL UPDATE

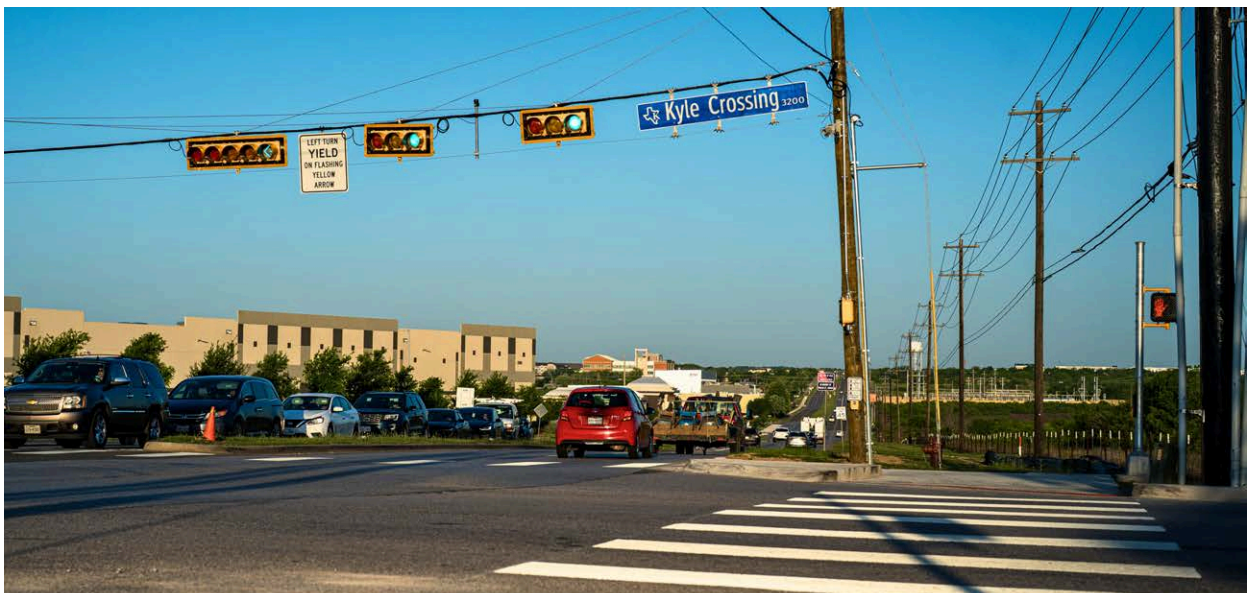
On Thursday, April 10, the newly installed traffic signal at Kohlers Crossing and Kyle Crossing was officially online.

The new traffic signal is an actuated traffic signal and is designed and programmed to adjust green time based on real-time traffic conditions detected by sensors, optimizing traffic flow and reducing delays.

The traffic signal and equipment performance will be tested over the next 30 days. During these 30 days, we ask all residents to report any issues with the traffic light via Kyle 3-1-1:

# CHECK IT OUT!

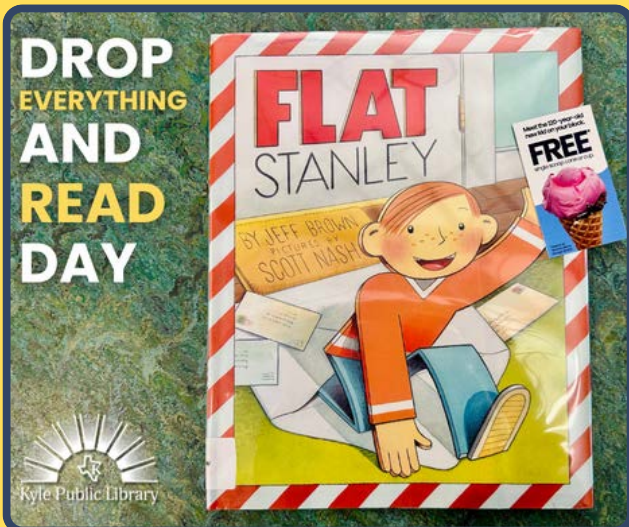
