



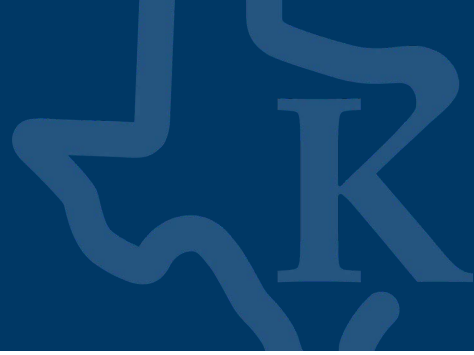

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Executive Summary

Eight Kyle Police Department officers were honored by Mothers Against Drunk Driving on June 30 for impaired driving enforcement and traffic safety work.

Several water and wastewater projects moved forward this week. At the FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station, crews installed the emergency generator, continued wiring, and began testing equipment that helps the pumps run at the right speed. At the CR 158 Ground Storage Tanks, interior coating work inside the elevated tank is complete, required property agreements are finalized, and the project is waiting on a schedule for permanent power from PEC.

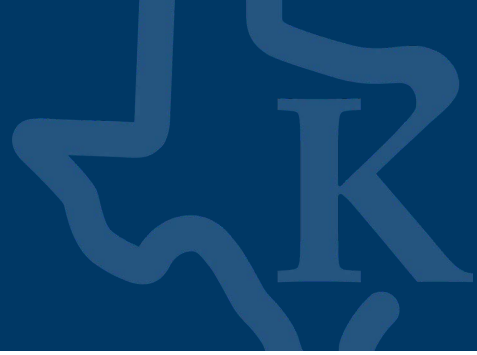
Wastewater projects also moved closer to completion. At Center Street Village, crews continued final testing, cleanup, temporary bypass removal, and connection corrections ahead of a final walkthrough in early July. At Plum Creek Golf Course, crews continued final drainage and cleanup work while the City reviews relocation of a nearby wastewater air vent, including how the change may affect system performance, cost, and schedule.

Road Bond work continued across several projects. The Kohlers to Bebee section is now open as part of the temporary Bebee Road detour, helping drivers move through the area while construction continues. Windy Hill Road construction is also moving forward now that the City has the property access needed for work to continue, and final plans for Kyle Parkway/Lehman Extension were submitted June 25, moving that project closer to bidding.

Facility and park projects continued advancing. The Kyle Senior Community Center was connected to permanent power after passing its final electrical inspection, and crews continued work on finishes, plumbing, flooring, lighting, and preparations for furniture and equipment. At Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark, crews continued concrete work, steel installation, decorative finishes, and pedestrian features in the street plaza and pump track areas.

Parks and Recreation hosted the 2nd Annual Adaptive Field Day at Lake Kyle Park with 36 participants and held the first Dive-In Movie of the summer at James Adkins Pool with 50 attendees. The Kyle Police Department was recognized at the Mothers Against Drunk Driving Awards Ceremony on June 30, with eight officers receiving awards for their work to help keep impaired drivers off the road.

Infrastructure and Project Updates

FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station

Staff Contact: Mike Murphy

Crews continued work at the Farm-to-Market 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station, including flow control valve installation, light pole foundations, pump room pipe painting, and work on the north access road. The emergency generator was set up, wiring continued, heating and cooling equipment was connected in the chlorine building, and testing began on the variable frequency drives, which help control pump speed.



Well Site #4 (La Verde)

Work continued at Well Site #4 with light pole foundation concrete placement, electrical line installation within the project area, fire alarm and heat sensor conduit, and pump control installation. Crews also completed backfilling the west discharge line and continued excavation for a storm drain manhole. Electrical line work is expected to be complete by July 10.



CR 158 Ground Storage Tanks

Crews continued electrical wiring in the pump building and cleanup around the elevated storage tank. Interior coating work on the elevated tank is complete, and cleaning of all levels is expected to be finished by the end of the week. All easements and encroachment agreements are complete, and the project is awaiting a schedule from Pedernales Electric Cooperative for permanent power installation.



Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement

Last week, crews completed the tie-in to the existing wastewater system, reviewed camera footage to verify the newly installed pipe was properly aligned, completed paving repairs, and continued punch-list work and cleanup on the west side of Farm-to-Market 150. This week, crews will continue reviewing test results, completing final site restoration, correcting two connections, removing the temporary bypass system, and preparing for a final walkthrough in early July.



Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

Last week, crews continued drainage channel improvements, closeout activities, sidewalk repairs, staging area restoration, and site cleanup. Additional review of the drainage channel identified several minor improvements, and city staff are working to resolve those items. This week, crews will continue final drainage channel work and cleanup, while the City reviews relocation of a nearby manhole air vent for system performance, cost, and schedule impacts.



Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion

Crews continued rebar and concrete placement for major treatment units at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, along with site piping, handrail, and stair installation. Coating work is being performed at night because of high daytime temperatures, and activities are being coordinated with plant operations staff. The non-potable water contractor completed rebar for the pump station slab and backfilled the final section of 14-inch pipe, while electrical cabinet installation remains pending correction of cabinet damage.



Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark

Last week, crews continued concrete work, site preparation, reinforcing steel installation, concrete formwork, structural steel fabrication, and utility improvements. This week, crews are expected to continue work in the street plaza and pump track areas, including concrete placement, structural steel components, decorative finishes, and pedestrian amenities.



Kyle Senior Community Center

Last week, crews continued installing door frames and doors, painting, electrical work, irrigation, sinks, toilets, and urinals. Kitchen floor tile was completed, and the building was successfully connected to permanent power after final electrical inspection. This week, crews are expected to continue doors, lighting, electrical devices, painting, flooring, remaining plumbing fixtures, and preparations for furniture, fixtures, and equipment installation.

Kohlers to Seton

Kohlers to Seton Extension (I-35 to Seton Pkwy)

Stage: Construction

Construction continues along the Kohlers corridor. Right-of-way and easements remain clear, allowing work to progress as planned. The Kohlers to Bebee section is now open to traffic as a detour from Bebee Road at the IH-35 frontage road, supporting continued construction while maintaining traffic flow through the area.

Kohlers to Seton Underpass (I-35)

Stage: Early Design

The schematic design remains at 90% completion. The final schematic was submitted on June 5, 2026, and transmitted to TxDOT on June 12, 2026. TxDOT's combined review of the schematic and Interstate Access Justification Report remains ongoing following approval of the Intersection Control Evaluation report.



2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)

Bebee Rd

Bebee Road (West)

Stage: Construction

Construction continues along the future Bebee Road alignment between Republic Drive and Dacy Lane. The Kohlers to Bebee section remains open as part of the temporary detour route, allowing traffic to bypass the work zone while construction advances. Right-of-way and easements remain clear for continued construction activities.

Bebee Road (East)

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 95% completion. The final 100% PS&E schedule continues to be updated based on the tie-in location change. The previously planned roundabout at Bebee Road and North Goforth Road has been removed from the project scope.



2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)

Windy Hill Rd

Stage: Construction

Construction continues following the Notice to Proceed issued on May 11, 2026. All required right-of-way, including easements, are now in possession, allowing construction to continue.



2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)

Old Stagecoach Rd

Old Stagecoach Road North

Stage: Final Design

The 100% final PS&E plans remain under review. Final plan review is dependent on PEC plans, and right-of-way is expected to complete the eminent domain process by August 30, 2026, with one parcel currently on hold under City direction.

Old Stagecoach Road

Stage: Final Design

The project continues final PS&E development following approval of the 100% PS&E package on June 22, 2026. Four dedicated parcels remain to be acquired, and utility relocation is expected to begin in Summer 2026.

Center Street (Off TxDOT System)

Stage: Construction

Construction activities continue following the Notice to Proceed issued on June 22, 2026. The baseline schedule is expected by July 1, 2026. Four dedicated parcels remain to be acquired, and utility relocation is expected to begin in Summer 2026.



Center Street

Center Street (East Segment, on TxDOT System)

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 55% completion. The 60% PS&E submittal is scheduled for October 5, 2026, while the TxDOT Review and Technical Coordination meeting remains to be determined. Final PEC surveys are currently on hold.

Bunton Creek Rd

Stage: Final Design

Draft bid plans have been submitted for PEC review. Bid advertising is planned for July 31, 2026, pending the CLSUD agreement with the City of Kyle. Coordination with PEC and Countyline Waterline SUD continues, and right-of-way clearance is anticipated by August 31, 2026.

Kyle Pkwy/Lehman Ext.

Stage: Final Design

Final plans were submitted on June 25, 2026, marking a significant milestone toward construction. Bid advertising remains scheduled for mid-July. AT&T utility relocation is underway, and right-of-way clearance is anticipated by August 31, 2026.

Marketplace Ave

Stage: Completed

Construction is 100% complete.

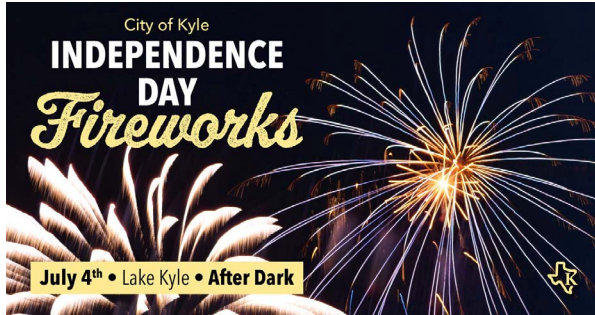

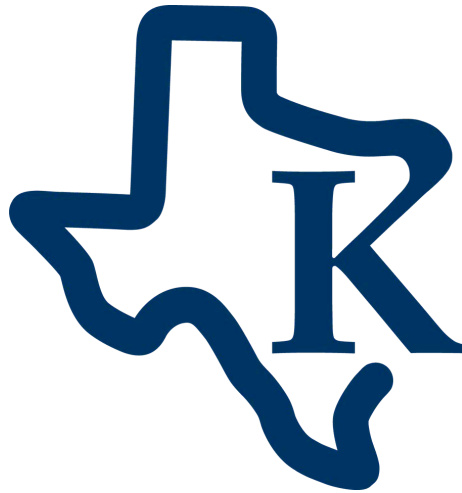
