New Alliance Water Source to Come Online in Early 2025

In early 2025, the first supply of Alliance Water from Phase 1B of the Carrizo-Wilcox Water Project will come online, making an estimated 1.73 million gallons of water per day available to the City of Kyle.

Last month in Kyle, work began on the Segment C pipeline, the final segment of the Alliance Water transmission system that connects multiple delivery points from Kyle to Maxwell.

"The state of this work in our community puts the finish line of a multi-year, collaborative project in sight and marks the beginning of a new era," said Director of Water Utilities Mike Murphy. "While we are excited for this transmission to come online, we are by no means done expanding our water portfolio and meeting our goal of providing long-term water solutions for our residents."

While Segment C work continues on the East side of I-35 near the Bunton Creek subdivision, Alliance Water take points are under construction at the Water Storage Facility along FM 1626.

The City of Kyle has awarded a contract to Archer Western to construct one of two Alliance Water take-points. Construction activities on-site have begun, beginning with the building of a 3.5 million gallon ground storage tank. Additional improvements will include an additional pump station, meter station, and associated equipment.

Eastside Mixed-Use Development

The Kyle City Council approved a Development Agreement for a 45-acre mixed used development on the East side of I-35, during the June 18, 2024 meeting.

The development, known as Project Two Step, will be split into two tracts of land along FM 150 East between Hill Street and Mikey Court. 15-acres to the East of FM 150 and 30-acres to the West, broken into three parcels consisting of retail and dining options, office space and multi-family residential land uses with a wide-ranging list of amenities including an amphitheater, dog park, additional park land, Vybe trail construction and a parking garage structure.

"This project is going to bring a lot of new, exciting attractions to the East side of Kyle. Filling an ongoing need for our residents, attracting new businesses, and creating a destination location for visitors," said City of Kyle Economic Development Director Victoria Vargas.

Requirements of the Development Agreement include pre-approved building materials, utility and capacity upgrades, and TxDOT improvements to FM 150 East including new deceleration and acceleration lanes, an additional signal to allow pedestrian movement between the developments, median modifications, turn lanes, and landscaping enhancements.

Over the next 20 years, expected revenue from this development is estimated at \$5.3 million in sales tax and \$10 million in property tax, which would go to the City of Kyle's Tax Increment Zone No. 6 to provide public improvements.

Kyle is currently under Amended Stage 3 Drought Restrictions

City of Kyle water utility customers can water by a hose and sprinkler, a soaker hose, drip irrigation, or automatic irrigation system from 7 p.m. -10 p.m. on their designated outdoor water use day **every other week**. The Amended Water Schedule applies to both business and residential.

Customers can water by handheld hose, or handheld watering can from 7 p.m.- 10 a.m. on any day. Any time a handheld hose is used, the hose must have a positive shut-off nozzle connected to the emitting end.
