**Section 111.1 2021 International Building Code**: A building or structure shall not be occupied in whole or in part until the building official has issued a certificate of occupancy.

To be considered for a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) the following actions must be complete:

	Inspection staff have confirmed the project can be safely occupied or stocked.
	Temporary Certificates of Occupancy are only available for commercial projects and can only be approved by the Building Official or their designated staff. Requests must be submitted via email to the Building Department.
	All fees must be paid, including the TCO fee. Please email once payment is made.
	All preliminary building, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical final inspections must be approved.
	The following final inspections (if applicable) must be approved or completed with minimal non-safety-related
	deficiencies.
