## III. ALLIANCE WATER CUTS RIBBON FOR CARRIZO WATER TREATMENT PLANT

The City of Kyle is celebrating a significant milestone in our commitment to providing long-term water solutions for our residents with the Alliance Water Carrizo Water Treatment Plant Ribbon Cutting held on Thursday, December 5.

The ceremony was held at the Rosanky, TX water treatment plant. City of Kyle Mayor Travis Mitchell joined in the ceremony, delivering remarks alongside the Mayors of San Marcos and Buda.

The Alliance Water project will increase the city's water supply by 1.7 million gallons per day by early 2025, a 26.7% increase in water capacity, with an additional 2 million gallons per day coming on line in 2027. Currently, the City of Kyle's water sources bring in an average capacity of 6.47 million gallons per day.

Alliance Water pipeline construction continues in Kyle. In the coming weeks, crews are expected to lay pipe under Highway 150 and continue laying about 6,400 feet of pipe southeast of SH-21 as they continue to construct Segment C.

Alliance Water officially formed in 2007 and is comprised of the cities of Kyle, Buda and San Marcos and the Canyon River Regional Water Authority. For more information on the City of Kyle's partnership with Alliance Water, visit <u>CityofKyle.com/AllianceWater</u>.

#### IV. KYLE PUBLIC LIBRARY UPDATES HOURS IN 2025

Starting Thursday, Jan. 2, 2025, the Kyle Public Library will be adjusting their hours to be open an additional 2 hours a week to the public.

#### Kyle Public Library Hours as of Jan. 2, 2025:

- Monday Thursday 9:30am 8:00pm (currently 10a-8p)
- Friday 9:30am 5:00pm (currently 10a-6p)
- Saturday 9:30am 4:00pm (currently 10a-4p)

These hours reflect opening each day 30 minutes earlier and closing one hour earlier on Fridays.

The Library updated hours after an evaluation of when patrons where using the library most and found most a high patron utilization in the mornings. The 1-hour change of closing earlier on Fridays is due to the lack of patron visits, no programs, and no use of meeting room space after 5 pm.

Since the library already has a full staff on site by 9 am, no changes in staff schedules will be needed for these hour updates.

#### Santa's Arrival Kicks Off 25 Days of Christmas

The holiday season officially kicked off with Santa's Arrival on Dec. 1, marking the start of the 25 Days of Christmas programs! The night started with a variety of Hays CISD choirs, local dance group, and the Kyle Twirlers entertaining the crowd with Christmas carols. Santa arrived in a Kyle fire truck to Mary Kyle Hartson Park filled with 50 craft and food vendors. Families were allowed to take free pictures with Santa. As Santa and Council stepped onto the park's stage, cheers erupted from the crowd, and the Christmas magic began to unfold with the lighting of the park's beautiful displays. The atmosphere was filled with the sweet scent of holiday treats, and the sound of laughter and holiday music echoed throughout, ushering in the season of joy and togetherness.

The holiday magic continues at Mary Kyle Hartson Park throughout December with a festive lineup of Christmas programming for all ages. From twinkling light displays that illuminate the park's pathways to holiday-themed activities, there's something for everyone to enjoy.

Children will also have the chance to participate in craft workshops and holiday games, while the park's cozy atmosphere offers the perfect setting for strolling, hot cocoa in hand, under the glow of festive decorations. #### **Green Ribbon Project Update**

The Green Ribbon project is 98% complete. Plant-bed preparation, laying of compost, and rep and tear has been completed. Digging for the concrete edging has also been completed. Final project details include wrapping up last mulching on the South location of Yarrington Rd and general clean up. TX Dot has a paid maintenance period of 24 months. There is one initial 90-day warranty and then a 24-month paid plant establishment period. Maintenance would likely be turned over to the city in March / April 2027.





#### **Conservation & Trails Updates**

The Kyle Parks and Recreation Department's Conservation and Trails Teams partnered with the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department's Land Management Program to harvest 250 Turks Cap root cuttings and transplanted them to City of Kyle parks for habitat restoration and enhancement. Staff installed 175 of the root cuttings in patches around the Cool Springs Trail in locations where volunteers had completed ragweed stem removal on November 16. This is a "plant and walk away" technique that can be used for some species and is estimated to be ¼ the cost of purchasing 4" pots and watering them to get them established. The Conservation Team transplanted 50 root cuttings at Steeplechase Park. In addition, the trails team members assisted with taking cuttings of Frog Fruit that was planted at the City of Kyle's Community Garden at Post Oak and transporting it to pots to develop root growth for future transplanting.

#### **Conservation & Trails Updates (Cont.)**

The Landscaping Team spread Inland Sea Oats along the Plum Creek Trail by Bunton Creek Park to assist with erosion control. In the last weeks, the teams have removed 31 invasive ligustrum from the Plum Creek Trail by Waterleaf Park.

While the Conservation and Trails team continues to grow with the addition of a Native Landscaping Team, the crew continues to work on other projects. The trails crew repaired a leaking waterline at the community garden, as well as worked with community service restitution workers on opening an additional 4/10ths mile of bike trail by Waterleaf Park. The combined teams mowed trailheads and trails, and began moving into their new storage area at Waterleaf Park.
