Chief's Corner: Edition 7, Jan 2026

Executive Summary

Cross Walk Beacons on Philomena Drive are now fully installed and operational, improving pedestrian safety at the crossing in front of IDEA Kyle.

Several utility projects reached notable milestones. Paving began on Schlemmer Street as part of the Schlemmer and Porter Wastewater Phase 3 project, moving the corridor closer to reopening. At Plum Creek Golf Course, sewer installation continued, with a one-month schedule extension under review due to delays. Preparations are also underway to restart construction at Center Street Village. Major water projects at FM 1626, CR 158, and Well Site #4 continued advancing through interior, electrical, and tank construction phases.

Roadway and bond-funded projects remain active, with interim improvements continuing at Kohlers Crossing and early construction activities beginning on the IH-35 Southbound Frontage Road waterline. Design, bidding, and construction continue across multiple 2022 Road Bond corridors, with coordination ongoing as projects move toward upcoming milestones.

Community facility projects also progressed. Interior construction continues at the Kyle Community Center, with framing, drywall, and HVAC work advancing. Earthwork remains underway at the Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark as crews shape the bowl and pump track areas. Pedestrian safety improvements on Philomena Drive are now complete, with flashing beacons operational in front of IDEA Kyle.

On the programs and services side, Parks and Recreation launched the Special Olympics soccer season, hosted recreational programming for older adults, and announced an upcoming public art ribbon cutting at Steeplechase Park. The City also welcomed new staff members supporting Kyle 3-1-1 and Parks and Recreation operations, strengthening service delivery capacity.

Parks and Recreation staff represented the City of Kyle at the 70th Southwest Parks and Recreation Training Institute, with two team members selected as conference presenters and Director David Lopez sworn in as the organization's new president. The department also received multiple regional awards recognizing innovative programming, promotional efforts, and long-standing professional service.

Schlemmer & Porter Wastewater Improvements Phase 3


The contractor began paving operations on Schlemmer Street this week. Roadway paving is expected to be completed by the end of the day on Monday, February 2, 2026.



FM 1626 Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station

Work continues on valve forms, chlorine sampling lines, and interior pump building construction. Roof truss installation has begun, and waterproofing and sealant work on masonry walls is complete.



Well Site #4 (La Verde)


Electrical work progressed with lighting and receptacles installed in both the pump station and chlorine building. HVAC ductwork and condensing units were installed, and lightning protection was completed for the chlorine building and generator.



CR 158 Elevated & Ground Storage Tank

Site maintenance and partial demobilization are underway as tank shell welding and preparation for the next shell placement continue. Electrical conduit installation is ongoing inside the elevated storage tank, while coordination continues on an encroachment agreement required for permanent power delivery.





Plum Creek Golf Course Sewer Line

SkyBlue Utilities continued installing 21-inch wastewater line and operating a pumping bypass. Additional manhole installation and pipe placement are planned for this week, and a request for a one-month schedule extension is being prepared due to project delays.



Center Street Village Wastewater Improvement


Joe Bland Construction is expected to remobilize to resume layout and installation of wastewater piping. Work will focus on advancing pipe placement as site activities restart.



Wastewater Treatment Plant Early Works Package

Construction continues at a steady pace with regular reinforcement placement and concrete pours for major treatment units. Backfilling of pump cans is also ongoing.



IH-35 South Frontage Road Waterline

Early construction activities began this week, including site staking and preparation work. Safety planning and utility setup have been completed to support upcoming waterline installation.

Kohlers at Kyle Crossing Turn Lane Extension

The contractor continues excavation behind the curb along the new eastbound acceleration lane near the Marketplace and Kohlers Crossing intersection. Curb and gutter removal at the intersection is expected this week, followed by grading and preparation for asphalt placement and subgrade testing.



Philomena Drive RRFB Installation

Installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) on Philomena Drive was delayed due to weather conditions and equipment issues. The work has now been completed, and the RRFBs are operational to support safer pedestrian crossings in front of IDEA Kyle.



Gregg-Clarke All-Wheels Skatepark

Earthwork continues on both the north and south sections of the site. Crews are shaping the bowl and pump track areas while continuing excavation and dirt removal in preparation for concrete work.



Kyle Community Center

Interior construction continues with steel support framing in progress and wall framing advancing throughout the building. Limited drywall installation has begun on the east side, HVAC ductwork is nearing completion, and framing has started in the southeast corner.

Kohlers to Seton

Stage: Construction

Construction continues along the Kohlers to Seton corridor, which will ultimately provide a 1.07-mile roadway connection from the IH-35 northbound frontage road to Seton Parkway. Right-of-way and easements are clear, allowing work to advance without property constraints. Current construction activities include roadway embankment construction, stormwater drainage culvert installation, detention pond excavation, and foundation work for retaining walls. Crews are also advancing bridge pier installation at the Kohlers and Seton intersection, installing base along the IH-35 access road, and performing utility coordination and relocations, including wastewater infrastructure installed within bore casings.

Upcoming work will focus on continued detention pond excavation, additional embankment and stormwater pipe installation, construction of the IH-35 northbound frontage road right-turn lane at Kohlers Crossing, Bebee Road embankment and base course placement, embankment work near the New Quest development, installation of additional bridge bents, retaining wall foundation work, electrical improvements near the Seton/CTC area, and waterline installation from the roundabout to Seton Parkway.



Kohlers to Seton (IH-35 at Kohlers Crossing)

Stage: Early Design

The schematic design for the IH-35 underpass remains at 90% completion. TxDOT provided draft Intersection Control Evaluation review comments on December 15, 2025, indicating that the previously proposed innovative intersection option is not supported. The design team is currently identifying an alternative intersection configuration to integrate into the schematic. Completion of the 100% schematic submittal will depend on TxDOT direction following completion of the Intersection Control Evaluation review, with a target submittal date of January 30, 2026. Environmental clearance for this segment was received in December 2025.

2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)



Bebee Rd

Bebee Road (West) **Stage: Construction**

Construction on Bebee Road (West) continues in coordination with the Kohlers to Seton corridor, with active work occurring along the future Bebee Road alignment from the IH-35 northbound frontage road to the Bebee Road/Kohlers Crossing roundabout. Current activities include roadway embankment construction, stormwater drainage culvert installation, embankment work near the future Vybe Trail, utility coordination and relocations, construction of retaining wall foundations, and continued detention pond excavation to support long-term drainage needs.

Upcoming work will continue embankment and base course placement along Bebee Road, installation of additional storm drainage systems, and continued bridge-related work to support future roadway connections.

Bebee Road (East) **Stage: Final Design**

Final design for Bebee Road (East) is almost complete. The 100% PS&E was approved on January 9, 2026 to address final comments.



2022 Road Bonds Update (Continued)

Windy Hill Rd

Stage: Construction Bidding

The Windy Hill Road project is in the construction bidding phase. Bid opening occurred on January 15, 2026. The right-of-way phase is expected to be completed by April 15, 2026.

Old Stagecoach Rd

Old Stagecoach Road North

Stage: Final Design

The 90% PS&E comment-resolution meeting was completed on December 15, 2025, and all final right-of-way offers have been sent. The project is advancing toward the 100% PS&E milestone, which is due on February 13, 2026.

Old Stagecoach Road

Stage: Final Design

Design is currently at 95% completion. The 100% PS&E is due on March 10, 2026.

Center Street (West Segment)

Stage: Construction Bidding

The Center Street off-system segment has entered construction bidding. Bid advertising began on January 5, 2026, and the pre-proposal conference was held on January 12, 2026. The bid opening is scheduled for February 19, 2026.

Center Street

Center Street (East Segment)

Stage: Final Design

Design for the on-system portion of Center Street (FM 150) is at 50% completion. The 60% PS&E submittal is due on February 24, 2026, and the TxDOT Review and Technical Coordination meeting has been rescheduled to March 11, 2026.

Bunton Creek Rd

Stage: Final Design

Design for Bunton Creek Road is at 95% completion. The draft project manual was approved in late December 2025, and bid advertising is scheduled to begin on March 16, 2026. Right-of-way negotiations are in their final stages.

Kyle Pkwy/Lehman Ext.

Stage: Final Design

Design remains at 95% completion. A cost-reduction design resubmittal was received on December 21, 2025, and is currently under review.

Marketplace Ave

Stage: Substantial Completion

Construction on Marketplace Avenue is approximately 85% complete. Final inspections for the roadway and Vybe Trail remain pending, and punch-list work continues.


UPDATES



CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS

All detectives will handle both person and property crimes.

CRIME TRENDS

We have seen a slight increase (7%) in calls for service and arrests. DWI and narcotics remain the most prevalent offenses in Kyle. Additionally, mental health and welfare concern calls have increased by 20% during this time period.


